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Course description:	The Comparative Literature course prepares the students of the Department of Albanian Language and Literature for research-scientific work in a specific field of literary studies. Comparative literary methodology offers specific knowledge of literary methodology, instruments and theoretical-literary notions such as: influences, relations, plagiarism, genesis of literary genres, intertextuality, translations, reception, etc. All of these will be presented in an interactive and practical process (through lectures), which will include examples of specific literatures and their main representatives.		
Purpose of the course:	The purpose of the Comparative Literature course is for the student to conceptualize notions, ideas and definitions such as: World Literature and National Literature as well as the interactions between them, on the one hand, and the universal literary values of all times, on the other hand.		
Learning outcomes:	Student: - builds notions, ideas and definitions such as: World Literature and National Literature as well as the interactions between them, on the one hand, as well as the universal literary values of all times - analyzes the structure of representative works of different literary periods. - interprets works and authors of Albanian and world literature in a comparative context - interprets knowledge about literature written in different countries and in different historical-literary periods, about languages, cultures and literary traditions.
