Course description:	The Albanian Syntax 1 is a well-balanced theoretically and practical course which aims at introducing students to basic theory concepts in syntax and enable them to apply them in practice. The main focus of the course will be placed on phrase structure in order to prepare students to further their knowledge on methods of combining phrases in order to form clauses. This course has for object of studies to analyze the words in the function of simple or compound sentence.		
Course objectives:	The language described is contemporary standard Albanian and the function of words. To ensure active acquisition of theoretical and practical knowledge, various exercises will be selected from various contemporary Albanian grammar books, in order to illustrate grammar rules and usage of parts of speech by examples which are characteristic and natural. In one word, grammar examples are descriptions of how Albanian works; i.e. they are a guide to help students understand the language, not rules to be memorized.		
	Students will be able to demonstrate proficiency in the		
Learning outcomes:	writing process; generating ideas, preparing drafts, revising, editing and presenting them. They will be able to write for different purposes (narratives, explanations, arguments for certain points of view, analysis and synthesis of ideas). Students will be able to adapt their text to different audiences (teachers, parents and children who teach them, peers and the		



wider public). They will be able to:

- a. to write and pronounce them correctly according to the codified norms of words, sentences and their different forms;
- b. to be able to notice (correct) spelling mistakes in texts;
- c. to correctly use nouns in prominent and indistinct, singular and plural; last verbs, adverbs, pronoun; the preposition; conjunction; the participle and the exclamation.
- d. The subject, predicate, direct and indirect object.
