Course description:	The course of Albanian Morphology 2 is also a descriptive and an explanatory account of Albanian language words classes (parts of speech). It is a basic guide to the grammar and usage of Albanian word-classes. In the way, it is a reference course to look up problems they encounter in using the language forms and their manages.  The course is a self-contained course. The designed material may be presented in class in more than one way. Most of the material conversing word-classes is organized inductively and should not present any difficulty for the students' understanding. Of course, we are open to present the material in a condensed from when that is required.	
Course objectives:	The language described is contemporary standard Albanian. To ensure active acquisition of theoretical and practical knowledge, various exercises will be selected from various contemporary Albanian grammar books, in order to illustrate grammar rules and usage of parts of speech by examples which are characteristic and natural. In one word, grammar examples are descriptions of how Albanian works; i.e. they are a guide to help students understand the language, not rules to be memorized.	
Learning outcomes:	Students will be able to demonstrate proficiency in the writing process; generating ideas, preparing draft revising, editing and presenting them. They will able to write for different purposes (narrative explanations, arguments for certain points of viet analysis and synthesis of ideas). a. to write and pronounce them correctly according to the codified norms of words, sentences and their different forms;

b. to be able to notice (correct) spelling mistakes in texts;

c. to correctly use nouns in prominent and indistinct, singular and plural; last verbs, adverbs, pronoun; the preposition; conjunction; the participle and the exclamation.
