Course description:	This course requires the literary subject of general literature. It deals with literary works, authors and phenomena according to the historical course (according to eras, stylistic formations, directions, currents, movements) as well as according to genre developments (genres, genres of literary types), with special emphasis on the analysis of the most important works important of all literature. The special focus will be on Greek mythology, Greek epic and especially Greek drama as well as the literary forms of Roman literature.	
Purpose of the course:	During this course, special attention will be paid to enabling students either individually or in groups to research phenomena, works and authors themselves through an interactive approach.
