Course Description:	The program of this subject foresees popular literature published from the beginning (1736) until today. The program of this course includes folk (oral) literature according to genres, starting from ritualistic songs of the weather and family, lyrical love songs, all models of oral epics, folk ballads, legends and historical songs, as well as selected Albanian folk prose according to genres. In the beginning, the entire artistic structure of legendary oral stories, fairy tales, legends and legends in prose will be treated, to continue further with the world of realistic prose such as: novelistic stories, narratives, and humorous stories, namely anecdotes and riddles. The program will contain complete and in-depth knowledge and information about the collection of folklore, its study, its types, the role and importance it has in the development of cultured literature, as well as the most important authors who contributed to its birth and development of Albanian folklore.	
Course objectives:	The purpose of this course is for students to acquire and develop their knowledge and skills for the collection, study and role of popular literature in the development and understanding of literature in general. In particular, students will be able to read, comment, analyze and interpret texts and works of this literature, namely, epic songs and legends, historical songs, love songs, wedding songs, lullabies, poems, anecdotes, riddles, etc. This course is also intended to provide students with the main and most important knowledge of this literature, as the basis for the development and advancement of cultivated literature.	
Expected results:	During and after completing this course, students will be able to: know Albanian popular literature;
