Course Description:	The "Albanian Novel" subject program aims to present our literary heritage of the novel as a literary genre, starting from its beginnings until today.  With this historical presentation of the birth, development and consolidation of the Albanian novel as a genre, it is intended to highlight the literary-historical conditions that have influenced its development and enrichment over time. In order to better understand and advance the Albanian novel through different historical periods, but also to draw out its original and distinctive features, we will focus on the most important figures, up to contemporary novelists.		
Course objectives:	The purpose of this course is for students to acquire and develop their knowledge and skills for the birth, development and consolidation of the Albanian novel. To know the historical conditions through which this genre has passed and from which its development has been conditioned. Also, this course aims to familiarize students with the most important individualities of the novel, with the types of the novel, with the specific features and characteristics that distinguish them from each other.		
Expected results:	During and after completing this course, students will be able to: <ul> <li>know the authors and the main values of the Albanian novel;</li> <li>distinguish the main peculiarities of the outstanding individuals of the Albanian novel;</li> <li>describe the conditions through which the development of the Albanian novel went;</li> <li>interpret the ideas, views, values and linguistic, historical aesthetic and artistic importance of the Albanian novel;</li> </ul>
